Motion by Kirkeberg, second by Schissel to approve building permit for Chad Heying at 505 W South Street (10' privacy fence -24' in length). Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Gerlich, Kleve and Kirkeberg. Motion carried.

Motion by Kirkeberg , second by Kleve to approve building permit (fence in back vard) for Jean and Kristina Smith at 301 N lowa Street. Aye: Kirkeberg, Kleve, Schissel, Sabelka and Gerlich. Motion carried.

Motion by Kirkeberg, second by Schissel to approve building permit for Paul and Barb Posivio at 406 W North Street (replace patio). Aye: Kirkeberg, Schissel, Sabelka, Kleve and Gerlich. Motion carried.

Motion by Schissel, second by Gerlich to approve building permit for The Warrior Wash at 100 E Henry Street (shelter, cement), Ave: Schissel, Gerlich, Kleve, Sabelka, and Kirkeberg. Motion carried.

Motion by Gerlich, second by Sabelka to approve Resolution #673 authorizing Internal Advance for Funding of Urban Renewal Project (Water and Sewer Infrastructure Extension Project). Aye: Gerlich, Sabelka, Schissel, Kleve and Kirkeberg. Motion carried.

Motion by Schissel. second by Kirkeberg to approve Resolution #672 approving contract and bond (West Clark Street Utility Replacement Project). Aye: Schissel, Kirkeberg, Gerlich, Sabelka and Kleve. Motion carried.

Motion by Sabelka, second by Schissel to approve change order #1 for the Maple Street Utility Improvement Project. Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Gerlich, Kleve and Kirkeberg. Motion carried.

Motion by Kleve, second by Kirkeberg to approve Agreement for Professional Services for construction administration of the Clark Street Utility Project. Aye: Kleve, Kirkeberg, Schissel, Gerlich, and Sabelka. Motion carried.

Motion by Schissel, second by Sabelka to approve Resolution #657 authorizing funds to be transferred prior to June 30, 2022. Ave: Schissel, Sabelka, Kirkeberg, Kleve and Gerlich. Motion carried.

Motion by Schissel, second by Kirkeberg to approve Resolution #671 approving and naming official city depositories. Aye: Schissel, Kirkeberg, Sabelka, Kleve and Gerlich. Motion carried.

Motion by Kleve, second by Kirkeberg to approve John Heying (Jr.) to SW Rec Board as the Representative of the City of Calmar (annual). Aye: Kleve, Kirkeberg, Sabelka, Gerlich, and Schissel. Motion carried.

The Fire Department report was in the packet. There were two paged calls for May.

The Police Department report was in the packet.

There was nothing reported for the Water/Wastewater and Street Department.

Don Wurtzel, Economic Development, reported that BOSS Tables and Kwik Star are in construction phase. The police truck has arrived. And mark your calendars for Tuesday, June 21 (Farewell Celebration-Dr. Wee) 4:00 – 6:30 p.m..

Mayor Frana addressed council with the proposal for the concrete pickleball court 25' x 50' (W Clay & Peter Street). The council was in favor of this proposal from Albertson Concrete. There was also discussion again regarding a splash pad, battling cage, lawns that need to be mowed in town, and a tower at our city dump site.

The council decided to move forward with the offer received from AI Brockmeyer to purchase vacate city lot on Webster Street.

WINNESHIEK COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS **Board Minutes**

Tuesday May 31, 2022 The Board of Supervisors met at 9:30am May 31, 2022 with Vick, Beard, Langreck, Vermace, and Rustad present.

Moved by Rustad and seconded by Vick to open the public hearing on the proposed FY22 Budget Amendment. Motion carried unanimously. No written or verbal comments were received. Moved by Rustad and seconded by Vermace to close the public hearing. Motion carried unanimously. Moved by Beard and seconded by Vick to adopt resolutions 22-60 and 22-61 amending the budget as published and appropriating the amended amounts to the various departments. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Vermace to approve the consent agenda which includes the minutes of the last meeting and fireworks permits for Bob Carolan and David Ferrie. Motion carried unanimously. Lora Friest and Stephanie Fromm, Winneshiek County Development and Tourism, met with the Board to discuss the Native American Information Project and placement of an interpretive information panel on the Courthouse campus. They also gave updates on other programs.

Lee Bjerke, County Engineer, met with the Board to discuss road matters.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Beard to adopt resolution 22-62, approving the placement of stop signs at the intersection of 220th Street and 315th Avenue. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Moved by Rustad and seconded by Beard to appoint Teresa Bockman to the remainder of the term of the vacancy on the Civil Service Commission. Motion carried unanimously.

Vermace outlined the idea and benefits of the Board establishing a committee to research and develop a mission/vision statement for the County Government as a whole. The majority of the Board members believe each department head should determine if this is something they want to pursue for their office, and how it might be implemented within their individual departments. Vermace asked whether the Board of Supervisors should consider a statement to help guide their actions. The Board decided to put this discussion on hold until after the next election cycle so that new Board members can weigh in on this discussion.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Rustad to adjourn to 9:30am Monday, June 6, 2022. Motion carried unanimously.
