The Turkey Valley School Board met in a regular session on Monday, June 9, 2025. The meeting was held in the Conference Room at Turkey Valley School, Jackson Junction, IA. Moved by Steinlage and seconded by Hageman to approve the agenda as presented. Carried unanimously. Moved by Manderfield and seconded by Stika to approve the consent agenda items: board minutes for May 12, 2025 - regular meeting, May 28, 2025, special meeting & work session. Appointments: Charles Hadacek - Bus Driver. Resignations: Courtney Koch - Kindergarten teacher. Carried unani-

Moved by Hageman and seconded by Manderfield to approve the financial reports and bills. General Fund \$147,464.73, Clearing \$14,161.06, Hot Lunch \$9,768.60, Capital \$10,390.11 PPEL \$32,990.88.

Moved by Hageman and seconded by Steinlage to approve the bid from Rapids Wholesale for \$16,606.43 for a new dishwasher for the kitchen. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Hageman and seconded by Manderfield to approve Pan O Gold Baking Co. for the bread bid for the 2025-2026 year. Carried

and diesel bids from Farmers Union Coop for 2025-2026 school year. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Hageman and second-ed by Manderfield to approve the LP Bids from Farmers Union Coop for 2025-2026 school year. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Stika and seconded by Steinlage to approve the sale of various items to help empty storage areas and clean up the building. Mr. Pinter and Mrs. Busta will organize the list and post it on social media. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Steinlage and second-ed by Manderfield to approve the following: Level 1 Investigator: School Nurse, Level 1 Alternate: School Principal, Section 504 Rehabilitation Act of 1973 - Turkey Valley Coordinator: Special Ed Director--Jessica Nelson, Migrant Liaison: School Counselor, Equity Coordinator: School Principal. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Stika and seconded by Steinlage to approve the 2022-2023 Audit. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Hageman and seconded by Manderfield to approve the following sharing agreements for 2025-2026: Paul Bakewell with South Winn for Industrial Tech. Sharing the following with New Hampton: Jessica Nelson as Special Education Director, David Pitz, or his designee as Maintenance director, Mike Kuennen as Transportation director, Christy Roethler as SBO, and Erik Smith as superintendent. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Manderfield and sec-onded by Steinlage to approve the field experience, student teaching, practicum and internship agree-ment with Buena Vista University. Carried unanimously.

Mrs. Hoy shared information with the board in regards to the fitness facility contracts. Wording has been updated to help clarify usage for the contract holders. The fee is \$50 per year for every person 18 or older. Each person will get their own FOB. Students 17 and under may come with their adult family member who has a fob. We do not have family fobs-except as noted for children. Moved by Stika and seconded by Steinlage to approve the clarification wording on the fitness facility contract. Carried unanimously.

Mr. Jurrens shared that the last couple of years EMC has added an unlimited 1% deductible to wind and hail damage. For an additional cost of \$11,398 we could join the Storm Protection Fund Group which would reduce the deductible to a maximum of \$10,000. At this time we have adequate funds to cover a loss in the management fund. Moved by Manderfield and seconded by Hageman not to participate in the Storm Protection Fund. Carried

unanimously.

Moved by Steinlage and seconded by Hageman to approve Christy Roethler as a signer on checks for the Turkey Valley School District accounts. This will be effective July 1,

2025. Carried unanimously.

Mrs. Hoy said the custodians and contractors are already busy in the building. A big thank you to Mr. Jurrens as this is his last board meeting at Turkey Valley. We appreciate all that you did for us. You will be missed.

Mr. Jurrens told the board that after preschool registration there were 6 to 8 preschoolers on a waiting list. Administration met to try to find a solution that was the best option to help as many students as possible. There will now be 2 preschool sections with 4 year olds only. The 3rd section will be 4 year olds and 3 year olds. The 3 year olds will attend 2 days per week. There will be a para in each preschool classMr. Jurrens said thank you to everyone for their support over the years. Turkey Valley is a great school!

The board thanked Mr. Jurrens for his many years of leadership at Tur-key Valley. His knowledge in school budgets and finances helped put Turkey Valley in a very good place financially. Thank you and the best of luck to you in retirement Mr. Ju-

County Ordinance No. 25/256

COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 25/256 AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE

EXISTING COUNTY CODE, WINNESHIEK COUNTY, IOWA:

Be it enacted by the Board of Su-pervisors of Winneshiek County, Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this adopting ordinance is to enable

Winneshiek County, Iowa, to comply with the provisions of Section 331.302(10) of the Iowa Code. Section 2. Adoption. Winneshiek

County, lowa, hereby adopts the existing Code of Ordinances for Winneshiek County, Iowa, pursuant to the provisions of Section 331.302(10) of the lowa Code.

Section 3. Content. The 2025 Code of Ordinances of Winneshiek County, Iowa, is composed of all ordinances presently in effect in Winneshiek County, Iowa. The 2025 Code of Ordinances shall

include this ordinance, readopting the existing County Code, and the Winneshiek County Auditor's certification of its adoption and passage. If the Code of Ordinances includes an ordinance which has adopted by reference the provisions of any statewide or nationally recognized standard code pursuant to the provisions of Iowa Code Section 331.302(5)(a), the county auditor

shall also keep on file, with the official copy of the County Code, a copy of such state or nationally recognized standard code.

Section 4. Format. The 2025 Code of Ordinances of Winneshiek County, Iowa, shall be compiled in loose leaf format.

Section 5. Official Copy. The Winneshiek County Auditor shall be responsible for the compilation, organization and maintenance of the official 2025 Code of Ordinances of Winneshiek County, Iowa, and shall keep an official copy on file in the office of the Winneshiek County Auditor.

Section 6. Additional Ordinances. All ordinances adopted after the effective date of the ordinance readopting the Code, shall be in the form of an amendment to or in addition to the 2025 Code of Ordinances.

Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance, after its passage and publication as required by law, shall be effective after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law

Moved by Faldet and seconded by Vermace for the County to enter a ten year management agreement with County Conservation for the wooded area around the Freeport Road Shop, to facilitate enrollment into the program. Motion carried unanimously. Schroeder will work with the County Attorney to draft an official management agree-

Andy Van Der Maaten, County Attorney, met with the Board to discuss county issues

Moved by Vermace and seconded by Faldet to renew the HIPAA Training agreement with ISAC. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board discussed possible adiustments to the salary matrix. Tony Phillips commented on the process. The Board asked Auditor Steines to work with Phillips to provide additional information for consideration at a future meeting.
