Reckless Driver Arrested After Warrant Found
 Drivers were forced off the roadway in Fayette County, and the driver at fault was found to be wanted on a warrant.
 At approximately 4:25 p.m. Oct. 23, the Fayette County Sheriff's Office took a driving complaint on a vehicle southbound on K Avenue traveling at high rates of speed, driving in the middle of the road and forcing oncoming traffic off the roadway.
 Law enforcement was able to stop the vehicle in the 600 Block of E. Charles Street in Oelwein. The driver, Cody Mason Skidmore, 30, of Oelwein, had an arrest warrant through Allamakee County. He was taken into custody on the arrest warrant and additionally charged with driving while license suspended and reckless driving, both simple misdemeanors. A search warrant was executed on Skidmore's vehicle, and illegal substances including heroin and methamphetamine were found. Paraphernalia, pills and drug testing kits were also found and seized. He was addition-

ally charged with two counts of possession of a controlled substance, both Class "D" felonies, as well as unlawful possession of a prescription drug, a serious misdemeanor, and possession of drug paraphernalia, a simple misdemeanor.
Woman's Car Rams Burr Oak Business
 Two women fighting in a parking lot eventually led to a woman ramming a building with a car, damaging LP tanks.
 Deputies were called Thursday at 6:35 p.m. to a Burr Oak business for an altercation that was occurring between two females in the parking lot of the business.
 During this incident the Country Express building was rammed by a vehicle, causing damage to the storage containers containing several LP tanks. The two females were initially separated after this incident.
 However, the two females met up again in the Freeport area, and deputies were once again called to that location for another altercation. Subsequently, Iesha Nailing, 27, of Decorah, was arrested and booked into the

Winneshiek County Jail for aggravated misdemeanor criminal mischief – third degree and disorderly conduct (fighting or violent behavior).
 The Decorah Police Department assisted the sheriff's office with this case.
Suspended Prison Term Follows Area Pursuit
 A Fayette County man who led a deputy on a pursuit at 100 mph has received a suspended term of two years.
 Michael William Bushaw, 29, of Arlington, entered a guilty plea, and also received a suspended fine of \$855 following the Oct. 4 incident, which began when a deputy attempted to pull over Bushaw at 2:47 a.m. at K Avenue and 40th Street.
 He will be on probation for two years in the matter.
Sex Offender Gets Five-Year Sentence
 A violation of the sex offender registry for a second time will see a Fayette County man serving five years in prison.
 Joel Francis Hass, of Elgin, entered a guilty plea in Fayette County District

Court to the charge. He was arrested back in March.
 Hass also received a suspended fine of \$750.
Waucoma Woman Arrested With Search Warrant
 A search warrant served in rural Waucoma has led to a woman facing charges of a drug distribution violation to a person under 18 and possession of a controlled substance – first offense.
 Lisa Jo Sims, 45, of Waucoma, was charged after a search in the 25000 block of Y Avenue Oct. 27.
 The drug distribution charge is a Class "B" felony while the other charge is a serious misdemeanor.

 Moved by Kuhn and seconded by Ashbacher to adopt resolution 21-39, the Living Roadway Trust Fund Grant resolution. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.
 Lynn Luloff, Lisa Radtke, and Dave Rooney, Winneshiek Medical Center Administrators, met with the Board to present the FY20 WMC financial report.
 Rachele Howe, Upper Ex-

plorerland Regional Planning Commission, met with the Board to give program updates.
 Krista Vanden Brink, Public Health Administrator, and Sean Snyder, Emergency Management Coordinator, met with the Board to discuss COVID19 updates.
 Moved by Thompson and seconded by Ashbacher to adopt resolution 21-40, scheduling a public hearing for the proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance for November 2nd at 10:00am. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote. Public notice will be published as required.
