Board Minutes March 2, 2026

The Board of Supervisors met at 9:30am March 2, 2026 with Kelsay, Vick, Langreck, Vermace, and Faldet present. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited, and the meeting was called to order.

Michael Kueny, County Engineer, met with the Board to discuss ongoing road department projects.

Moved by Vermace and seconded by Faldet to approve the updated job description for the Maintenance Foreman position. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Vick to give a three step adjustment to the current Maintenance Foreman. Motion failed for lack of a second. Moved by Vermace and seconded by Faldet to give a four step adjustment to the current Maintenance Foreman.

Motion carried with Kelsay, Vermace, and Faldet voting aye; and Vick and Langreck voting nay.

Moved by Faldet and seconded by Vermace to approve the amended FY26 DOT five year construction program as presented by the Engineer. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Faldet to adopt resolution 26-28, awarding the contract for the Frankville Road project to Mathy Construction for \$2,877,749.76. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Moved by Faldet and seconded by Vick to adopt resolution 26-29,

changing the funding agreement for the W14 in Spillville project. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Kelsay to approve the low bid of \$194,968.24 by Fahner Asphalt Sealers for the Otta Seal project on W40. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Kelsay and seconded by Vick to adopt resolution 26-30, setting a public hearing and bid procedures for the old DHS Building and land south of Decorah on Highway 52, with bids due March 26th and the public hearing held at 10:30 on March 30th. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote. Public notice will be published as required.

Andy Van Der Maaten, County Attorney, met with the Board to discuss county issues.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Kelsay to approve the consent agenda which includes the minutes of the last meeting and the liquor license for Silvercrest Golf & Country Club. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Hageman and seconded by Stika to approve the agenda as presented. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Stika and seconded by Steinlage to open the public hearing for the 2026-2027 School Calendar at 7:00 PM. Carried unanimously. Mr. Smith shared information in regards to the 26-27 calendar. There were no questions on the public hearing for the 2026-2027 School Calendar. Moved by Manderfield and seconded by Hageman to close the public hearing for the 2026-2027 School Calendar at 7:08 PM. Moved by Steinlage and seconded by Stika to adopt the 2026-2027 School Calendar and that the district will go with hours, as presented. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Stika and seconded by Manderfield to approve the consent agenda items: board minutes for February 9, 2026, regular meeting. Appointments - Aleya Grimes, English/Spanish Teacher 26-27; Jr Hackman, Asst Baseball Coach. Resignations-none. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Manderfield and seconded by Hageman to approve the financial reports and bills. General Fund \$215,863.32, Clearing \$20,225.80, Hot Lunch \$13,824.59, PPEL \$6,142.74, SAVE: \$7,562.35 Carried unanimously.

Mr. Smith presented information for a Facility Assessment Plan for Turkey Valley Community School. Tyler Hackman with Carl A. Nelson & Company shared a proposal with the board. They will assess the conditions of the facility, both inside and outside of the building. The information in this report can give the board a heads up to possible repair costs/needs. The board can then include this when planning future budgets. Moved by Hageman and seconded by Stika to approve the Facility Assessment Plan proposal from Tyler Hackman with Carl A. Nelson & Company, \$40,200.00 and consultant reimbursable expenses for travel. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Stika and seconded by Steinlage to approve the 2026-2027 AEA Cooperative Purchasing Agreement. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Manderfield and seconded by Hageman to approve 3.28% total package increase for contracts/salaries for teachers for 26-27 school year. This is tentative pending TVEA approval. Carried unanimously.

Mr. Smith stated that we had 3 snow days in 25-26. Two days were built into the calendar. At this point we are still above the 1080 hours required for the school year. Moved by Stika and seconded by Steinlage to approve that Turkey Valley will not make up the 3rd snow day or any days until we are under the 1080 hours. Carried unanimously.

Principal Hoy reported that TV held preschool registration. Parent teacher conferences took place March 3 & 5. The musical will happen on March 27 & 28. The Pops Concert was a success. The Gala is Saturday, March 21st. She also shared screener results.

Mr. Smith said that the Erate proposal is out for bids. The board will hold a special meeting on March 30th, 7:30 AM to approve the purchases prior to the April 1st deadline.

There is a special board meeting on Monday, March 23, 2026 @ 5:00 for Budget Hearing #1. The next regular school board meeting will be held on Monday April 13, 2026 @ 7:00 PM.

The TV board asked about hosting a meeting with the New Hampton board prior the April 13th meeting. Mr. Smith will bring it to the NH board and see if that date/time works for them.

Moved by Hageman and seconded by Steinlage to adjourn at 7:55PM. Carried unanimously.
