BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Calmar, Iowa, as

That Chapter 106 of the Municipal Code of the City of Calmar, Iowa, is hereby amended by changing the wording in section 106.10, subsection 1 as follows:

Fees. The City Council shall establish by appropriately adopted ordinance fees for refuse collection and disposal services for residential establishments within the City limits of the City of Calmar, Iowa. The fee will be \$ 11.82 per month per dwelling unit for each single-family dwelling and two-family dwellings. For dwellings with three or more units, the required fee will be \$ 11.82 or each dwelling unit per month unless a dumpster is provided at the multiple family dwelling unit. Garbage contractor may waive fees during times the dwelling unit is vacant.

Repealer. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
