The Turkey Valley School Board met in a regular session on Monday, December 12, 2022. The meeting was held in the Elementary Meeting Room at Turkey Valley School, Jackson Junction, IA. Ernie Schmitt called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. The following Board Directors answered roll call: Ernie Schmitt, Jody Steinlage, Leon Shatek, Don Blazek Jr. and Katie Stika.

Moved by Blazek and seconded by Steinlage to approve the agenda as presented. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Blazek and seconded by Stika to approve the consent agenda items. Board Minutes: November 14, 2022, regular meeting; Appointments: Ashley Walz - volunteer assistant girls basketball coach. Resignations: none. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Steinlage to approve the financial reports and bills. General Fund \$59,380.63, Hot Lunch \$12,484.49, Clearing \$38,164.53, PPEL \$39,792.30, Capital \$6,049.35 Carried unanimously.

Senior Career Students introduced themselves and stayed to attend the meeting. Ms. Nystel informed the board that on January 21, 2023, Turkey Valley will host IHSSA District Speech. There will be 22 schools in attendance. Thanks to so many people who have volunteered to help throughout the day. This is a big event and it is an honor to host it.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Blazek to approve the Director

District Map as presented. Carried unanimously.

Mr. Jurrens informed the board that he spoke with the architect and although he didn't have numbers yet, he feels confident that they will be ready for bid letting in January or February.

Moved by Blazek and seconded by Steinlage to approve the Good Sportsmanship Resolution as presented. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Stika to approve Alex Gisleson as the Junior high Turkey Valley and New Hampton girls wrestling coach. New Hampton Schools currently pays for the JV/V boys wrestling and the soccer coaches. Turkey Valley would like to offer to pay for the 7&8 girls wrestling coach. Thank you to New Hampton Schools for your years of support. The Turkey Valley board and all of Turkey Valley School appreciates the great working relationship that these two schools have.

Moved by Blazek and seconded by Shatek to approve Carrie Weber with Ahlers and Cooney, PC as the official attorney for Turkey Valley Community School District. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Stika and seconded by Steinlage to approve The Calmar Courier as the official newspaper of the district. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Stika to approve the first reading of Board Policies, Series 400, excluding 401.14, 402.02 & 408.01 which were reviewed and revised at the November 2022 board meeting. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Steinlage and second-

ed by Stika to set the superintendent's six month evaluation for January 9, 2023 following the regular school board meeting. Mr. Jurrens requested this evaluation meeting be in a closed session. Carried unanimously.

Mrs. Hoy thanked Ms. Meyer and Mr. Gisleson for a great high school concert. She also thanked them and all the behind the scene helpers for a great elementary holiday concert as well. There were over 400 people in attendance at the elementary program! She said that Java Junction will open soon and the greenhouse is near completion. Thanks to Ms. Nystel for taking the lead on hosting the IHSSA speech contest.

Mr. Jurrens told the board that there were great motivational speakers at the school board convention. Turkey Valley will have its Vulnerability Assessment on December 14, 2022. The Assessment will contain recommended security upgrades for the building. Turkey Valley could receive up to \$100,000.00 to help pay for any updates and recommendations from this walk thru.

The next regular school board meeting will be held on Monday January 9, 2023 @ 7:00 PM.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Steinlage to adjourn at 7:30 PM. Carried unanimously.

The Fort Atkinson City Council will hold a public hearing on January 4, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. local time in the meeting room of the Fort Atkinson Community Center located at 303 3rd St. NW, Fort Atkinson, Iowa to hear comments for and against proposal to vacate and convey City-owned real estate described as follows:

A part of street right-of-way described as follows:

Proposed Right-of-Way Reversion Parcels Lots 2002-3, 2022-4, 2022-5 and 2022-6, of that Part of 3rd Street, located adjacent to and south of: Lots 5-8 of Block 33, Lot F in the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 8, Township 96 North, Range 9 West of the 5th P.M., and Lots 10-13 of Block 34; all in the Original Town of Fort Atkinson, City of Fort Atkinson, Winneshiek County, Iowa.

(hereinafter referred to as "Vacation Parcels"); and

A copy of the proposed Right-of-Way Reversion plat is on file with the City Clerk for review by the public.

In the event of vacation of the Vacation Parcels, the City desires to convey said parcels as follows:

A. Lot 2022-3 to David Humpal;
B. Lot 2022-4 to Charles and Arlene Lynch;

C. Lot 2022-5 to Dale L. and Jennifer M. Leuenberger, husband and wife, ("Grantees"); and
D. Lot 2022-6 to Brian Leuenberger.

(collectively, the grantees named above may be referred to as the "Grantees")

That if the City Council does approve the vacation of the Vacation Parcels, that the City proposes to convey said Vacation Parcels properly executed Quit Claim Deeds to the Grantees, subject to the reservation of any utility easements, and that said conveyance shall be "as is" for the payment of all City expenses related to the transaction, including but not limited to legal fees and publishing costs as reasonable consideration for said conveyance.

At said time and place, comments will be received at the public hearing by the City Council on the question of the vacation and conveyance of said parcel of real estate.
