Don Wurtzel, Economic Develop-ment, reported that we are authorized to receive money for the new police vehicle, but there are more procedures we have to complete first (3 bids). Notification for the grant on the Train Station should be sometime in June 2021.

Mayor Frana presented the complaint we received from a citizen and discussed Alliant pulling all the poles along 175th Street (poles for Diane Drive).

There was a brief discussion regarding nuisance properties.
