PRESENT: P. SCHMITT, LEUENBERGER, GLASS, SCHROEDER, AND K. SCHMITT. ABSENT: PAUL HEROLD

KAY SCHMITT CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER AT 7 P.M.

Recently Mayor Paul Herold suffered a stroke which will take some healing time. Mayor Pro Tem is Kay Schmitt. Motion was made by Schroeder, seconded by P. Schmitt, to approve K. Schmitt to assume duties of the Mayor in his absence as Mayor Pro Tem and sign checks in his absence. All Aye. Carried.

Tom Madden, SEH Engineer, updated Council on Lagoon and second well projects. The Lagoon plans were turned into Iowa DNR in June, so waiting on their approvals. Madden recommends completion for August 2023 to give two seasons for contractors. In Herold's absence, Madden will communicate directly with Greg Barta.

On the second well, Madden requested an extension from Iowa DNR due to its review not getting back in time to apply for CDBG July 1. The electric engineer is still working on the 3-phase plan. Madden will forward to Johansen the application fee and construction permit fee and will need checks to submit. Plans to bid in winter and build in summer of 2022.

Greg Barta advised the shop door was hit and damaged. Barta got a bid from Albertson to repair and has submitted to Joe Neuzil for reimbursement for the damage. Barta called Northway to come and pull the well and inspect, as he has been losing PSI this week. The trees at the park have blight at the top; Barta called Fort Nursery to come and spray about 60 trees. Barta looked at the computers offered by the grant funds from the state for technology updates up to \$9,500 and recommended applying for a new laptop for Johansen and five Surface Pro Tablets for Council and cameras to go with them in case of future zoom meetings. Council agreed to apply and Barta will submit. Need to also discuss with IT when setting them up to make sure we have the right Cybersecurity ICAP recommends.

Motion was made by Glass, seconded by Schroeder, to approve July 7, 2021 Minutes, July Clerk Reports and Monthly bills as presented. All Aye. Carried.

Motion was made by P. Schmitt, seconded by Glass, to approve Resolution 324 to approve setting a public hearing for September 1, 2021 to submit an application to CDBG for the second well. All Aye. Carried.

The nuisances sited within the community were given final date to abate of August 1, 2021. Several have been cleaned up, and Dawn Kraft submitted a letter requesting an extension. P. Schmitt and Leuenberger will inspect and advise Johansen who is not yet in compliance, and Johansen will issue the fine. If not paid in 30 days, amount will be assessed to taxes.

No building permits were submitted.

Motion was made by Glass, seconded by Leuenberger, to approve the 28E with NEIA Community Action for Funding for Services. All Aye Carried.

Motion was made by P. Schmitt, seconded by Schroeder, to approve payments to the following: Fort Atkinson Ball Team \$200; Communi-

ty Band \$250; Little League \$200; Oak Hill Cemetery \$750; Fireworks \$200. All Aye. Carried.

Motion was made by Glass, seconded by P. Schmitt, to approve the Winneshiek County Mutual Aid Agreement-2021 submitted by Sean Snyder, EMA Coordinator. All Aye. Carried.

Other business: discussed upcoming election in November, 2021. Bob Glass and Lori Schroeder will be up for re-election. Papers to be on the ballot can be picked up from the Winneshiek County Auditor.

Next meeting will be Sept. 1, 2021 at 7 p.m. in the Community Center. Motion to adjourn was made by Leuenberger, seconded by Schroeder. All Aye. Carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

The Turkey Valley School Board met in a regular session Monday, Aug. 9, 2021. The meeting was held in the Elementary Media Center at Turkey Valley School, Jackson Junction, IA. Don Blazek, Jr. called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. The following Board Directors answered roll call: Ernie Schmitt, Leon Shatek, Brenda Muetherthies and Don Blazek, Jr. Jody Steinlage was absent.

Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Muetherthies to approve the agenda as presented. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Muetherthies to approve the consent agenda items. Board Minutes: July 12, 2021, regular meeting; Appointments: Kelli Chensvold as paraeducator; Resignations: none; Open Enrollments: none Carried unanimously.

Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Shatek to approve the financial reports and bills. General Fund \$299,960.31, Hot Lunch \$3,129.71, Clearing \$6,980.63, PPEL/Capital \$56,355.55. Carried unanimously. No public forum.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Schmitt to approve the second and final reading of board policies: 200.3 Responsibilities or the Board of Directors, 213 Public Participation in Board Meetings, 213.1 Public Complaints, 401.14 Employee Expression, 502.3 Students Expression and Student Publications, 502.3R Student Expression and Student Publications Code and 606.2 School Ceremonies and Observances. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Muetherthies to approve the interfund loan of \$300,000.00 from general fund to capital fund with an interest rate of 6%. The loan to be paid back by June 2022. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Muetherthies and seconded by Schmitt to approve the 2021-2022 NICC Health Occupations and College Course contracts. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Muetherthies to approve the ES-SER (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief) Funding Plan. The plan is flexible and can be adjusted and updated as we move forward. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Schmitt to approve the CSIAAC Committee (Comprehensive School Improvement Advisor Committee) for 2021-2022 as presented. Carried unanimously.

Mr. Jurrens reviewed the 2019-2020 audit report with the board. Moved by Shatek and seconded by Muetherthies to approve the audit as presented. Carried unanimously.

Mr. Jurrens shared the Return to Learn Plan with the board. Masks cannot be mandated, but they will

be encouraged. There will not be online or hybrid options available for regular class curriculum this year. There will not be an extra custodian working during the school days this year, but staff will have access to sanitizers, shields, dividers et al. to use as needed. Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Shatek to approve the plan as presented. Carried unanimously.

Mrs. Cuvelier congratulated the softball and baseball teams and players on their accomplishments and recognitions received for their seasons. It was directed by the state to have the last week of August (dead week) as a no practice or camp week for our students. Kudos to our custodians for a great job done on our building. It looks amazing! Mrs. Cuvelier shared with the board that she is looking into an app for staff to submit leave requests and find substitutes with. She will update the board as she continues to look at this option. August is a busy month of preparing for school, registration, teacher inservice, and returning back to school.

Mr. Jurrens shared with the board that we have had some new families registering their children to attend at Turkey Valley this year. Our enrollment numbers are up and they look good. Preschool numbers have also increased since the board approved the third preschool classroom. Mr. Jurrens shared the ISASP results with the board. They were outstanding! The student achievement scores showed remarkable improvement from two years ago in spite of dealing with COVID-19. Most grades were at or above the state average percent of students proficient.

The board would like to thank the custodians for a job well done. The board recognizes that it takes a lot of hard work to make this school look like it does. It is easy to have a lot of pride in this school when it is clear that the custodians put a lot of pride into taking care of it. Thank you to New Hampton Food Service for the great work on the summer meals program. Thank you to all who helped, prepare, pack food, load, deliver and hand out meals. Turkey Valley served many families and everyone's hard work to get these meals into our families hands was greatly appreciated! Thank you so much to everyone who goes above and beyond to make Turkey Valley a great place!

There was discussion regarding the upcoming school election. Nomination papers will be available Aug. 23, 2021 and due Sept. 16, 2021 by 5 p.m. to the board secretary.

The next regular school board meeting will be Monday, Sept. 13, 2021 at 7 p.m.

The Board discussed the weekly meeting time and will discuss it further at a future meeting.

Stephanie Fromm and Lora Friest, Winneshiek County Development and Tourism, and John Schroeder, Commercial Lender at Decorah Bank & Trust, met with the Board

to discuss the County pledge to the Childcare and Discovery Center. They also relayed the possibility of Winneshiek Medical Center providing ground on their campus for the building, but that was still being discussed by the Hospital Board. Moved by Rustad and seconded by Vermace to pledge \$500,000 from the Coronavirus Fiscal Recovery Funds towards the Discovery Center part of the project with disbursement details being determined at a later time. Motion carried with Beard, Langreck, Vermace, and Rustad voting aye and Vick voting nay.

Andy Van Der Maaten, County Attorney, met with the Board to discuss county issues. The Board also asked him about bonding for road projects. He will consult with the bonding attorney and provide additional guidance about this at a future meeting.

Bjerke and the Board took a tour of several road projects.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Rustad to adjourn to 9:30am Monday, August 9, 2021. Motion carried unanimously.
