February 28, 2022
Present: P. Schmitt, Leuenberger, Glass, K. Schmitt. Absent: Schroeder

Paul Herold called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
Discussed SOO Green Project to run underground lines for energy along the railroad. Our water line will need to go under their line at Highway 24 by the tracks. Will need to set a public hearing at next meeting.

Andy Roach, from Iowa DNR, requested the City help with mowing the Fort grounds and 2 churches again like they did several years ago. They are open to negotiating, and DNR has a mower on the grounds as well. Roach stated it takes about 5 1/2-6 hours, and average of \$4,300-\$4,500 seasonally. Barta advised with a part time seasonal helper this summer, they would be able to do it. Barta will work with Roach to negotiate the terms and then bring to Council.

Maggie Burger, Speer Financial, called into the meeting to discuss funding options for the Lagoon Project. SRF would not allow the City to use an Annual Appropriation for the Debt Limit, so there is only \$760,000 available, rest would have to be in a Revenue Debt.

We do have \$300,000 CDBG and \$300,000 WTFAP grant. With Administration costs for the grants, engineering, and Lagoon bid, total loan size is \$4,142,000. Will need to raise sewer capital fee by \$30 to cover the portion of Revenue Debt payment to \$55/month. There may be a new infrastructure bill coming, or more loan forgiveness money coming through DNR, but not at this time. Motion was made by Glass, seconded by K. Schmitt, to approve Resolution 333 to set a Public Hearing to enter into a General Obligation Loan and Disbursement Agreement for March 17, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. All Aye. Carried.

Tom Madden sent an email stating the DNR has been delayed on the construction permit for the 2nd well. We will need to submit for project extension request due to the July 2022 deadline to get the well done.

The Board of Supervisors met at 9:30 a.m. Feb. 21, 2022 with all members present (Beard electronically.)

Moved by Rustad and seconded by Vick to open the public hearing on the Courthouse Tower Rehabilitation Project bids. Motion carried unanimously. Bethany Jordan, Martin Gardner Architecture, reviewed the bids and project plans with the Board. No additional comments were received. Moved by Vermace and seconded by Vick to close the public hearing. Motion carried unanimously. Moved by Beard and seconded by Vermace to accept the low bid of \$318,968 by Building Restoration Corporation. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Rustad to approve the consent agenda which includes the minutes of the last meeting, the claims filed with the Board, and to accept and file the monthly report of the VA Commission. Motion carried unanimously.

Jeff Kuboushek, Roads Superintendent, met with the Board to discuss road matters. He reviewed the quotes for shop loaders. The Board will take action on the loader quotes at a future meeting.

Moved by Rustad and seconded by Vermace to adopt resolution 22-41, reducing the increase to the Board of Supervisors salary to 0% without effecting the recommendations to the other elected officials. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

The Board reviewed the second run of the budget. No further changes were recommended. They instructed Auditor Steines to proceed with the budget process with the 2nd run as the final run. The public hearing for the levy rates will be held March 7 after which a public hearing on the budget will be set.

Andy Van Der Maaten, County Attorney, met with the Board to discuss county issues.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Vermace to adjourn to 9:30 a.m. Monday, Feb. 28, 2022. Motion carried unanimously.
