ORDINANCE NO. 456 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CALMAR, IOWA, 2003, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO MANDATORY COLLECTION OF SOLID WASTE AND MANDATORY PAYMENT OF FEES

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Calmar, Iowa, as follows:

That Chapter 106 of the Municipal Code of the City of Calmar, Iowa, is hereby amended by changing the wording in section 106.10, subsection 1 as follows:

I. Fees. The City Council shall establish by appropriately adopted ordinance fees for refuse collection and disposal services for residential establishments within the City limits of the City of Calmar, Iowa. The fee will be \$ 11.25 per month per dwelling unit for each sin-

gle-family dwelling and two-familv dwellings. For dwellings with three or more units the, the required fee will be \$ 11.25 or each dwelling unit per month unless a dumpster is provided at the multiple family dwelling unit. Garbage con-tractor may waive fees during times the dwelling unit is vacant.

Repealer. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Severability Clause. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional. When Effective. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE AMENDING THE COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE ZONING CLAS-SIFICATION FROM A-1 AGRI-CULTURAL DISTRICT TO A-R AGRICULTURAL RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT FOR THE HEREIN DE-SCRIBED PROPERTY.
