The City of Calmar City Council has approved an Ordinance amending the The FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT Chapter of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Calmar, Iowa.

Amendments are included within the following Sections: Adding Chapter 158 Floodplain Management to Building and Property Regulations. Section 1- Definitions, Section 2- Statutory Authority, Section 3- General Provisions, Section 4- Administration. Section 5- Establishment of Zoning (Overlay) Districts, Section 6- Standards for Floodplain (Overlay) District, Section 7- Appointment and Duties of Board of Adjustment, Section 8- Nonconforming Uses, Section 9- Penalties for Violation, and Section 10- Amendments as it pertains to the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) for Winneshiek County, the City of Calmar, panels 19191C0410C, 19191C0450C dated 2-22-2024.

Violations of the provisions of this Ordinance or failure to comply with

any of the requirements (including violations of conditions and safeguards established in connection with grants of Variances) shall constitute a misdemeanor. Any person who violates this Ordinance or fails to comply with any of its requirements shall upon conviction thereof be fined not more than \$500. Each day such violation continues shall be considered a separate offense. Nothing herein contained prevent the City of Calmar from taking such other lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy violation.

Winneshiek County Sanitarian Resolution No. 24-38 for the Destruction or Control of Noxious Weeds

RESOLUTION NO. 24-38 for the Destruction or Control of Noxious Weeds

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Winneshiek County, Iowa

That pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 317 of the 2021 Code of

lowa, it is hereby ordered: 1. That each owner and each person in the possession or control of any lands in Winneshiek County shall properly spray, cut, burn, or otherwise destroy or control all noxious weeds thereon, as defined in this chapter, at such time in each year and in such manner as shall prevent said weeds from blooming or coming to maturity, and shall keep said lands free from such growth of any other weeds as shall render the streets or highways adjoining said land unsafe for public travel. Noxious weeds shall be cut or otherwise destroyed or controlled on or before the following dates and as often thereafter as it is neces-

sary to prevent seed production: PRIMARY NOXIOUS WEEDS: June 15 2024 for musk thistle quack grass, perennial sow thistle, Canada thistle, bull thistle, field bindweed, horse nettle, leafy spurge, wild parsnip, perennial pepper-grass, Russian knapweed and buckthorn.

SECONDARY WEEDS: June 15, 2024 for butterprint cocklebur wild mustard wild carrot, buckhorn, sheep sorrel, sour dock, smooth dock, poison hemlock, multiflora rose, wild sunflower. puncture vine, teasle and shatter-

2. That each owner and each person in the possession or control of land in Winneshiek County infested with any noxious weeds including

perennial sow thistle, bull thistle, field bindweed, horse nettle, quack grass, leafy spurge, perennial pepper-grass, Russian knapweed, poison hemlock, wild sunflower and teasel, shall adopt a program of weed destruction, described by the Weed Commissioner which in five years may be expected to destroy and will immediately keep under control such infestations of said noxious weeds.

3. That if the owners or persons

in possession or control of any land

in Winneshiek County fail to comply

with the foregoing orders, the Weed Commissioner shall cause this to be one an the expense of said work. including cost of serving notice and other costs, if any, be assessed against the land and the owners 4. Quack grass, where acting as

soil binder, may be eliminated from the above regulation, per section 317.13. 5. The multiflora rose won't be

considered a noxious weed when cultivated for use understock for cultivated roses or as ornamental shrubs in gardens, per section 317.1(2)

6. That the County Auditor be and is hereby directed to cause notice of the making and entering of the foregoing order by one publication in each of the official newspapers of the county.
