the meeting was called to order. Moved by Faldet and seconded by Vick to open the Public Hearing on the proposed FY26 budget. Motion carried unanimously. ditor Steines reviewed the budget process and details. Several questions from the public were answered. No additional comments were received. A landowner with a timber vard requested that portion be removed from the amendment. neighbors of the timber vard had complaints about their operation.
