Fence permitting was also discussed. Bob Guttromson was present inquiring about trees in the right-of-way. Currently the city has an ordinance prohibiting planting in the right-of-way. Mr. Guttrom-son stated the benefit of shade to homeowners. Council discussed and agreed to consider changing the city ordinance to allow planting in the right-of-way with approval of a permit (no fee) and with city approval of location and species. They are also looking into a "beautification fee".
