A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the county auditor's office by noon on Monday, November 8, 2021. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification. BOARD MINUTES MONDAY OCTOBER 4, 2021 THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MET AT 9:30 A.M. OCTOBER 4, 2021 WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

Lee Bjerke, County Engineer, met with the Board to discuss road matters.

Moved by Beard and seconded by Vermace to enter into contracts with AgVantage FS for propane, diesel, and gasoline per the approved bids. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Rustad and seconded by Vermace to adopt resolution 22-16 setting the public hearing on the reclassification of 233rd Avenue as class "C" for Oct. 25 at 10 a.m. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Rustad to approve the consent agenda, which includes the minutes of the last meeting, the Class C Beer Permit for Farmers Win Coop, and to accept and file the quarterly report of the County Auditor. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Vick and seconded by Rustad to open the public hearing on the rezoning request for Ness/Holland. Motion carried unanimously.

Tony Phillips, Planning & Zoning Administrator reviewed the actions by the P&Z Commission which held a public hearing and recommended approval of a conditional rezoning. Bill Holland was present to answer questions and explain the project. Holland also reviewed the conditions and signed a letter of agreement once an acceptable agreement was negotiated.
